Share needs and ideas, follow simple instructions, and grow confident in two languages.



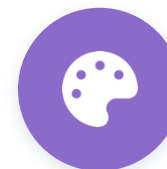

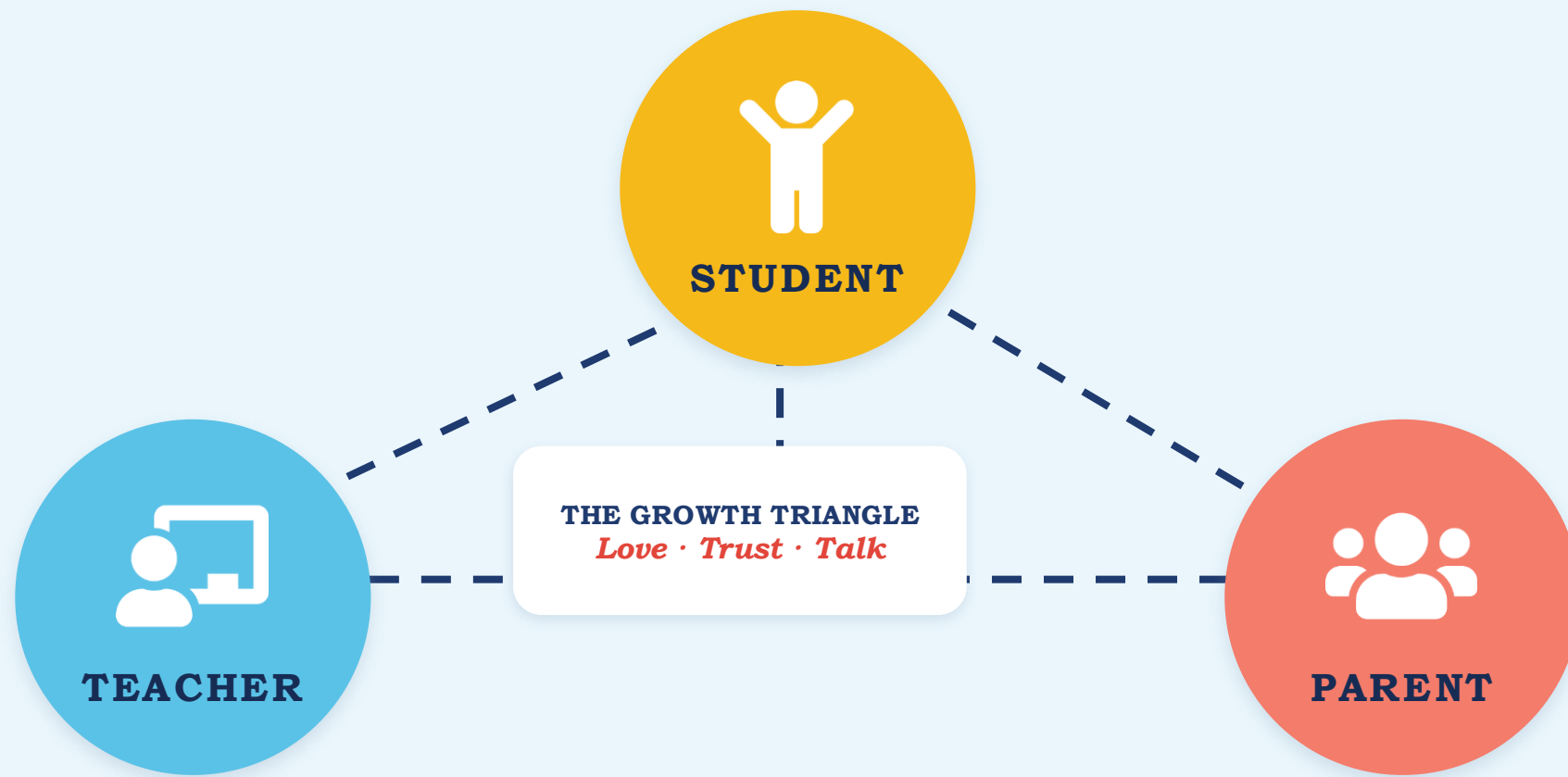

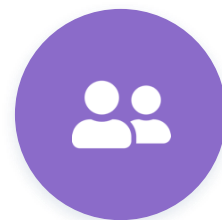

At School — Mindful Use

- ✓ Smartboards used for stories, songs and visual concepts
- ✓ Screens are a tool — not a substitute for teaching
- ✓ Use books, toys, and school items carefully



At Home — Our Gentle Request

- ♥ Limit screen time to under 1 hour per day
- ♥ Co-watch — sit beside, talk about what they saw
- ♥ No screens during meals or one hour before bed
- ♥ Choose stories, drawing and outdoor play over screens

The American Academy of Pediatrics recommends under 1 hour of screen time/day for 6-year-olds.

Essential stationery (pencils, eraser, sharpener, crayons) maintained throughout the year.

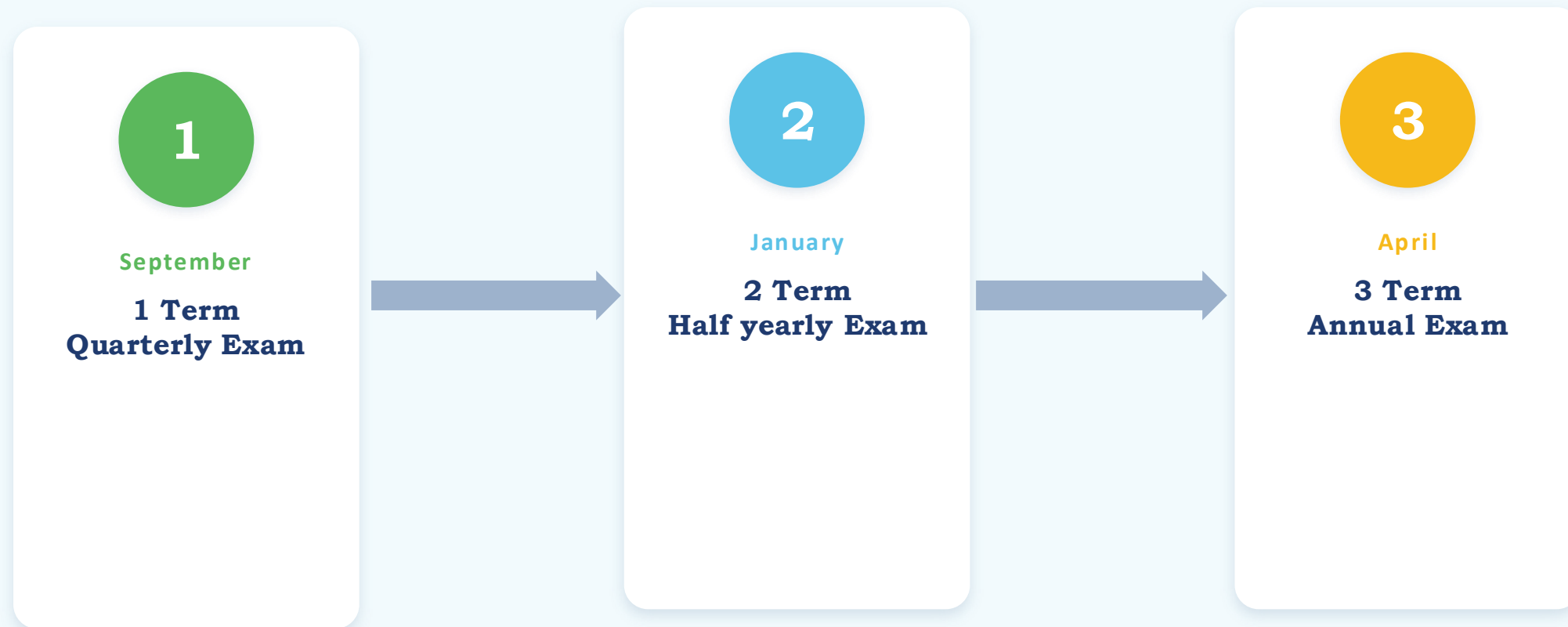


Daily Bag Check

07

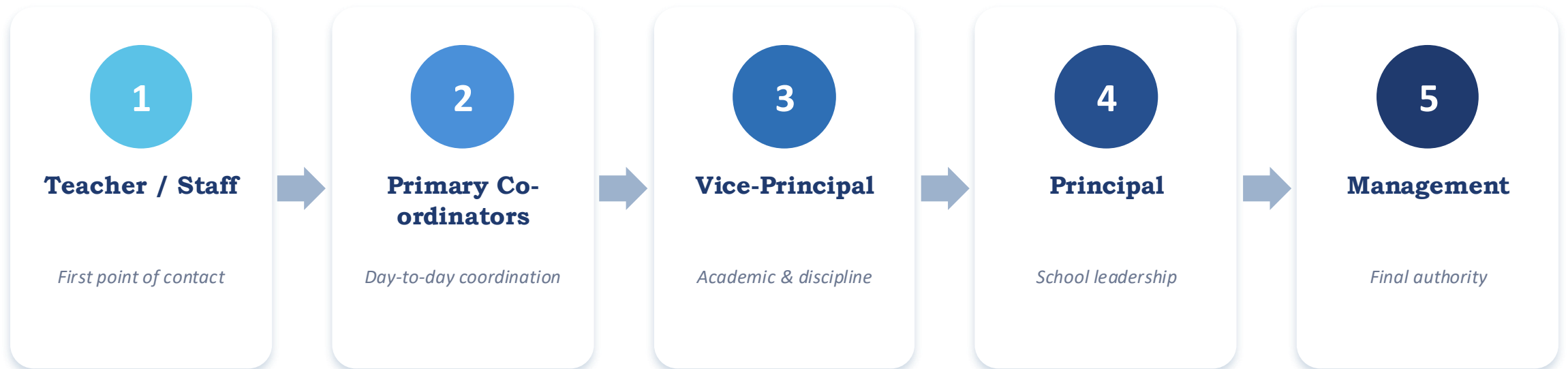
No half day is allowed to any child unless there is an emergency.
